



2. Silver Jubilee of Ruhalaya (Theology)

Theology section of Ruhalaya Major Seminary celebrates its silver jubilee (1997-2022) this year. The beginning of the jubilee celebrations took place on 4 August 2021, inaugurated by His

Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel in the presence of Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General of the MST in a simple manner. His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry is invited for the conclusion of the jubilee scheduled on 25 November 2021. Due to the situations of the pandemic Covid-19, the jubilee celebrations are very minimal and simple.

Let us take this opportunity of silver jubilee to thank God for the kind of progress and contributions made by the seminary in the formation of 312 priests to the Church. We are indebted to the ecclesiastical authorities, eparchial bishops, visiting faculty, benefactors, students, neighbouring communities and very specially to the Eparchy of Ujjain for all their support to the seminary in varied ways. The Rectors, staff and other formators who served/serve the seminary in the past and present deserve our special appreciation and gratitude in facilitating its growth. Unitedly as a family, let us wish jubilee greetings to Ruhalaya and pray that it rightfully fulfils the mission of training future missionaries relevant to the times. An evaluation of the formation programme of Ruhalaya is being planned to be conducted after the jubilee celebrations.

3. Plenary Council – 2021



The Plenary Council of the present tenure of administration in the MST was held for five days from 4 to 8 October 2021, at Deepti Bhavan. The Council consisted of 20 members including six elected delegates and 14 ex-officio members. The meeting formally began at 10.00 a.m. on Monday 4 October with the welcome and inaugural address by the Director General. Rev. Fr Roy Pullatt was elected as the secretary of the Plenary Council.



A general briefing on the mission regions, delegations, coordination and the seminaries were done in the first four sessions of the plenary council by the respective representatives present. The rest of the sessions engaged discussions on the items of the agenda of the Council which were codified by the Secretary General and other items directly received by the Director General. During the morning sessions of the final day, the minutes of the discussions were presented by the elected secretary. The Council concluded with the formal closing message of the Director General at the end of which he declared that having fulfilled the required formalities, the plenary council of present tenure of administration is concluded. Thus the plenary council-2021 came to a close by 2.00 p.m. on Friday 8 October 2021. Copies of the report of the Council will be sent to all the members when it is made ready by the elected secretary.

4. New Schedule of Extraordinary General Assembly

The Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) which was convoked on 25 February 2021, had scheduled to start its sessions on 15 September 2021. The procedures for the EGA like the election of

the delegates by the election committee, and the compilation of the agenda by the agenda committee are done in time. The copies of the agenda for the EGA are already circulated electronically to all members of the MST and the printed copies are delivered to all delegates of the assembly.

However, considering several limitations of the present context the schedule of the Extraordinary General Assembly is postponed to **15 March 2022**. The delegates of the EGA shall arrive at Deepti Bhavan latest by 4.00 p.m. on 15 March 2022. The EGA will formally start by 6.00 p.m. with the inaugural session and will continue until it finishes its agenda.

Other than the uncertainty of the third wave of Covid-19, other factors that compelled the postponement of the EGA include: the unfinished extension/renovation works at the Generalate due to heavy rain-falls and lockdowns, and the inconvenience for the delegates from our seminaries (11 delegates) to attend the assembly during the academic year. Let us earnestly pray for the smooth conduct in the new schedule. This information was already shared to all of you through a special circular (Circular No. X/24) dated 1 August 2021 and is appended to this bulletin.

5. Aligning the District of Nagpur with St Paul Region, Ujjain

Based on the discussions held during the joint meeting of the Regional Councils and the Central Council held between 27-28 January 2020 and with the consent of the General Council and in consultation with the Regional Directors of St Paul and St Alphonsa Regions, the territorial boundaries of St Paul Region and St Alphonsa Region have been modified by aligning the civil district of Nagpur (Maharashtra) with St Paul Region, separating it from St Alphonsa Region that it originally belonged to. This arrangement is in the context of the territorial modification of the Regions effected through the contract between the Eparchy of Shamshabad and the MST on 3 July 2020 which resulted in the extension of St Paul Region bordering the district of Nagpur. Geographically, the city of Nagpur is closer to Ujjain than to Kolhapur. By appending Nagpur to St Paul Region,

the missionary involvement already initiated by St Paul Region in Nagpur (started in January 2020) would receive momentum to plan its programmes in a formal setting. The above rearrangement in the territorial boundaries of the two Mission Regions came into effect on 23 August 2021.

6. Samvet and Maliparampil Memorial Webinar -2021

Samvet and Maliparampil memorial webinar was held from 19-21 September 2021 (from 6.30 pm to 8.00 pm) through online (zoom) platform. Rev. Frs James Kurukilamkatt and Sebastian Kizhakkel (presented through Fr Manoj Parackal) were the two chief resource persons for the first two days. The third and the final day was dedicated to retrieve and celebrate the fond memories of late Rev. Fr Joseph Maliparampil, facilitated by the personal sharing by selected group of persons who had acquaintance with Fr Maliparampil at different levels. The webinar was organized by Thomasine Research Centre (TRC) under the leadership of Rev. Frs Francis Kureeckal and James Kurukilamkatt. A detailed report of the same is presented by TRC towards the end of this bulletin.

11. Meeting of MISAL

MISAL (Missionary Institutes of Societies of Apostolic Life)

organized a zoom meeting of all the heads of the Missioanry Societies on 15 April 2021. Since MST is exclusively a missionary Society we are given membership in it. Twenty two Superior Generals from different continents were




connected to it. It was an honour and privilege for the MST to be part of this online platform to share our various ad gentes missionary involvements in India and outside. The Director General highlighted in his sharing the Balaswa project in Delhi, Himalayan and Odisha missions. The Participants really appreciated enthusiasm and zeal of the MST in its mission ad gentes activities.

12. SMRC Webinar

There was also a webinar conducted by SMRC (Syro Malabar Religious Conference) on 30 July, from 6.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. on

the subject Opportunities and Challenges of Religious Life in the Post – Covid World. More than 200 Major superiors connected with this



online platform together with the Father and Head of the Syro Malabar Church. The Major Archbishop in his concluding message appreciated and acknowledged in a special way our missionary methodology and involvements in carrying out mission *ad gentes* activities in various parts of India.

13. Meeting of Major Superiors and Rectors of Major Seminaries

An online meeting of the Rectors and Major Superiors of the Religious Congregations was held on Tuesday 27 July from 10.00 am to 12.30 p.m. Cardinal Alencherry was invited for the inaugural message. In his inaugural address the Major Archbishop exhorted to be vigilant of the secular values creeping into religious and priestly life. Approving the need to adapt all that is good in the world, he reminded, not to compromise the essential values of the religious commitment. In this digital and internetera, he said, it is necessary to take care of fostering the Gospel values and thus becoming effective witnesses of Christ our Lord. The Rectors and Major Superiors have to see that our future religious and priests are equipped for the evangelization of today's world. He urged the members to focus all our formation activities for the glory of God and to the good of the people.

Cardinal Mar Alenchery in his concluding remarks said that he personally favours the proposal to have a centre for higher studies in Missiology, and he promised that this matter will be discussed in the forthcoming Synod. It was proposed by Fr Chandy Kalthoor and supported by Director General in the online meeting. He also emphasised the need for having a meeting of all the rectors of major seminary to share their difficulties and anxieties. He was of the opinion that the participation of the parents of the seminarians must be there in the formation. He suggested having a *Formation Council* for every seminary in which the representatives of the parents also could be included. The formators must be very keen in analysing the nature, tendencies, the positives and negatives of the world today; and then

should equip the seminarians to take up challenges to evangelise the world. Formation should take care of the psychological maturity of the seminarians. They must be able to enter into mature relations.

14. Finance Council of the MST

An online meeting of the Finance Council was held on 16 August 2021, from 2.30 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. The Director General presided over the meeting. All the members of the Finance Council were present for the meeting.

15. Ongoing Formation Programme

The ongoing formation programmes for the junior priests of the last five ordination batches are scheduled to take place online from 21-23 October 2021 at Vishwadeepti Missiology Centre, Kolhapur in St Alphonsa Region. The details of the programme will be informed to the junior priests in the upcoming days.

16. Elevation of Delegation to a Region

In accordance with 'Resolution Number Two' of the Tenth Ordinary General Assembly-2018 and following the norms of C58 of the Constitutions and Directives of the Society, the process for constituting St Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation (Delhi) as the fourth Mission Region was initiated on 23 August 2021 (Please see: Circular No. X-25 in the Appendix).

As part of the process, an open invitation has been made to all priest-members of the MST, who would like to be assigned to the proposed Mission Region, to send their names to the Director General bv November 2021 email. (by <mstgeneralate@gmail.com> or by postal letter only). The names received will be considered in consultation with the respective Regional Director of the applicant and with the consent of the General Council (C&D 44).

Our Fathers and Sisters work hard to alleviate the sufferings of the people and to bring relief to them in their struggles and moments of pain.

C. St Alphonsa Region

The Covid-19 pandemic has led our entire mission works to an unprecedented challenge economically and socially. The recent flood that happened during the last week of July made the situation worse. But our fathers were not ready to give up easily. We gave a fight, which became a great relief for the many who were affected.

1. Flood and Timely Intervention



The torrential downpours during the last weeks of July necessitated the discharge of water from dams which led to floods in Chiplun, Watul, Kolhapur and Sangli. The whole Sangli town was

flooded and the water reached even the ground floor of Santhome

School. But the timely decision of Fr Binoy Vechupadinjarethil to shift all things from the ground floor to the upstairs saved all things. He also helped the nearby villages with necessary things.



Kolhapur also was

affected very badly. Many villages near the rivers were engulfed by water. The Sangli Mission Society in collaboration with Caritas India helped 900 families who were affected by floods in Kolhapur and Sangli districts.



The ground floor of our Special School in Watul was submerged in the floodwater. Nearly 80% of Chiplun town was flooded and 213 lost their lives. The

Mary Matha Church, Chiplun was drowned in water and all its interiors got spoiled. More than 150 families were given shelter at our school in Chiplun. Fr Joe Anson Kattuthara shared all that is left with these families. These people



were experiencing the love of Christ through the hands of the Mary Matha community. Frs Michael Puthenpura and George Kottukappallil extended help to Chiplun from Ratnagiri. Frs Binoy, Siju, Subin, Lijo, Anish, Arun and 10 non-teaching staff from Santhome School, Sangli helped to clean up Mary Matha Church in Chiplun.

2. Reopening of Schools

It is both exciting and encouraging to report that after the nearly two years break, the schools are now alive and rejuvenated with the presence of kids. The enthusiasm and cheerfulness of the students are filling the whole school campus. Most of our schools in the Sangli Mission have already started the classes from lower primary onwards.

with their parish priest. They are given opportunity for counselling and a special confessor is arranged for confessions. Following day morning we have Holy Mass and they receive Holy communion

after a long gap of six months.

We find that people are longing to receive Holy Communion. They are also very happy to spend one day in prayer sacrificing their daily income We have two retreats in a week

3. Deepti Foundation, Delhi

a. New Centre in Basantdada Patel Nagar: Delhi along with the other parts of country was badly hit during the second phase of pandemic. During the assessment we found out that there are many unemployed and wandering children. There is also demand for vocational trainings. To address the immediate the situation we have opened a new non-formal centre in Basantdada

Patel Nagar. There are 45 children attending the centre as per the pandemic protocol.

- b. Visit of Country Head of Kindernothilfe: Funding Agency of Deepti Foundation Kindernothilfe has got a new Country head Ms. Alka Singh, he had visited the Deepti Foundation on 12 August 2021. She reached the Gyaansarovar Child Resource Centre at 10.30 am. Fr Olapurackal, Director of Deepti Foundation gave a floral welcome to the guest. Fr Director briefed about the organization and projects. Further she visited the non-formal centres of the projects. By 12.45 pm we had lunch. After the lunch we had discussions on the current situation in the area. By 2.00 pm we have concluded the program.
- c. Unseasonal Rain-falls: Comparing to previous years Delhi witnessed a unseasonal monsoon this year and it lasted till 30 September. Due to the torrential rain there were waste mountain slide and water logging in the adjourned places of Gyaansarovar Deepti Foundation Child Resource Centre. E. Odisha Mission

1. Covid-19 Relief Work:

Jyoty Marg Education and Charitable Trust, Odisha made another



history in Odisha by reaching out to more than 1500 tribal families and widows with the spark of love and care through the Covid-

19 Project of *Sneha Charitable Trust* and *Buddhist Tzu Chi Foundation*. We executed this programme in ten civil blocks with the help of three Mission Centres, such as Nirmal Jyoty Social action Centre, Baliguda in Kandhamal, Sacred Heart Centre, Laxmipur in Koraput and Little Flower Mission, Kundra in Koraput. The lockdowns that followed the first and second waves of the pandemic made these people unemployed and led to the brink of starvation. The people are all dependent on daily wage labour and we reached them with the survival kits including food, groceries and household cleaning materials, masks and sanitizers. It was a great chance for us to address the immediate needs of people of our mission. Through this project we could reach out to the maximum with the love and care and it helped us to bring the ray of hope and smile to the face of poor and needy tribal people of Kandhamal, Kalahandi, Rayagada and Koraput districts of Odisha.

2. Visit of the Director General and Team



MST Odisha Mission was blessed with the visit of Very Rev. Fr Director General and Rev. Frs Peter Kavumpuram and Joy Kunnel from 9 to 16 September 2021. The visit was marked with the visits to all mission centers, village visits and prayer services, blessings of the community care centers (CCC-village prayer halls) inauguration of the non-formal education programs for the school dropout children of the villages, blessings of the foundation stones for the presbytery buildings in deferent missions, etc.

Last day of the visit was set apart for the sharing and the evaluation by the missionaries on the basis of their experiences in the field for

last two years. It was flowed by a planning session. The meeting concluded with the message from the Director General,

Until then, the FIAT Mission had been helping us with the complete financial support for the maintenance of the missionaries and mission center, meeting every expense and providing every necessary provision like vehicles, driver, furniture, etc. When they withdrew the support, except the sumo-jeep and a motor-bike, everything else was left for the use of the mission. On 13 September 2021 Very Rev. Fr Director General honoured FIAT Mission for their committed service and support in developing the mission in M Rampur and handing it over to MST. As a token of our love and gratitude, a memento was presented to Bro Ceatley George, the Director of FIAT Mission by Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor. We the MST family, especially the Odisha Mission express our gratitude and love for the great support and collaboration that the FIAT Mission makes in this mission.

Loving Greetings from Fr Kuriakose Moozhayil in the Archdiocese of Hamburg, to all our dear fathers of MST.



I have been working in the Archdiocese of Hamburg since 2010 and in the Parish St. John the Baptist, Bad Segeberg since 2015. There are three more Priests working here and we have nine parishes. The nearest Parish is eight kms and the last parish is 52 kms

away from where I stay. Only 10% of the people are Catholics and all others belong to Evangelist or free Evangelist churches. There are so many who do not believe in any God. It is a mission area and is known as Diaspora. Due to the present situation of corona, we had to celebrate this year's first holy communion in nine parishes on different Sundays. In my place we had to celebrate it in two groups. The first group celebrated on 5 September and the second group in the 3 October 2021. On such special Sundays we have three holy Mass so that all the faithful get the opportunity to take part in the holy mass.

4. Canada

a. Pastoral Updates from Nelson, British Columbia

After a long awaited reopening the churches for worship, we were thrilled to celebrate Holy Mass in all the three parishes: Christ the King Parish, Oliver; Our Lady of Lourdes church, Okanagan Falls; and St. Gregory's Church, the First Nation Catholics of the Parish. But some of the unidentified persons burned St. Gregory's Church on June 20, 2021.

i. Burning of the Churches: The diocese of Nelson had four active First Nations Churches in our deanery. All the other 25 churches are inactive. But all of our four active churches were burned in just six days. We had resumed our Church activities and Holy Masses with alternative arrangements. Bishop Gregory Bittman was there as the Pastor to feed and protect the sheep with encouraging words.

This arsoning was a warning for all the Catholic Churches for their further security. Thereafter many of our churches have CCTV Cameras, gates to control Church premises and parking space from any suspicious activities. In spite of being a Christian Country, we are suffering from many persecutions.

Persecution and martyrdom were the beginning landmarks of our Church from its origin till the present times. We are not an exception from these persecutions. Every martyrdom gives growth and



strengthening of the Communities in faith.

ii. Car Accident: After years of my driving, I had a car accident on 23 September at 1.30 p.m. on my way to the next parish for pastoral work. Both of us drivers were hospitalized and the cars were written off. I may get a few dollars to buy another car. I was consoled and supported by many of my parishioners, classmates, batch mates and family members. Let me thank God that I am alive and in one piece to continue my service as a missionary.

Mission work is always hard in any part of the world. But we are proud to be in our MST as missionaries capable of adjusting with any person, any place, any country, any liturgy and any situation. We are proud of our formation and missionary zeal. But we should thank everyone with whom we work, that they are able to accept and accommodate us priests who are sent to them for service. As I see, the parishioners as well as co-workers who have to work with us are better heroes than many of us as they are the sheep. Mt. 28:20) and intends to express the closeness of the Lord and the Church to the life of each elderly person, especially in this difficult time of pandemic. The archdiocese, parishes welcomed their elderly very specially and had special prayers for them.
- ii. The Archdiocese of Regina Lay Formation Program: The sad truth is, nearly 75% of young people, even those raised in religious homes, will leave the Church by the time they are 25 - well before many of us retire! Some of the most common reasons given for leaving one's faith behind include; perceived conflicts between faith and science, Christians behaving badly, a lack of evidence for the existence of God and difficulties with some of the Church's teachings. The Archdiocese of Regina has already prepared a detailed study project and dates to hold this programme in the best way possible.
- iii. St Philomena Walking Pilgrimage 2021: The third annual Saint Philomena Walking Pilgrimage was in August 2021. The pilgrimage started at St Gerard's in Yorkton on Wednesday August 11th, and it ends at Our Lady of Lourdes Shrine at Rama on Saturday 14 August. This was a supported walk, rest stops and meals were provided and a trailer carries camping supplies between nightly stops. Pilgrims were invited to join for all or part of the walk. Pilgrims were free to walk at their own pace, and may join, even for part of a day.
- iv. National Day for Truth and Reconciliation: The Canadian government proclaimed 30 September as a new national statutory holiday, a national day for 'Truth and Reconciliation' to honour survivors, their families, and communities. The Catholic Church has a significant role and responsibility for Truth and Reconciliation in Canada. Archdiocese of Regina had different programmes and

included special prayers in the liturgy of the day. This day gave us an opportunity to reflect on the history of residential schools and grow in our understanding towards a commitment to true healing and reconciliation.

v. Clergy Study Days: It takes place every year in October four days of study programme for the clergy of the diocese. The Archdiocesan clergy along with the Archbishop are fully there to attend to refresh their mind and heart with new enthusiasm and vision. It was a great time to meet and stay together, but unfortunately, due to the pandemic the study days are online.

The three MST priests (Frs Thattuparampil, Akkattukudiyil and Mandapathil) who are serving the Archdiocese of Regina are keeping fine and enjoying the summer days fulfilling their responsibilities whole-heartedly. We take some effort to meet together at least once a month and share our fellowship. It's Rosary month, we keep rosary in our parishes before the Mass, and the faithful too come and join very earnestly. May Mother Mary intercede for us.

5. Switzerland

a. New Corona situation in Switzerland

The number of new reported coronavirus cases rose over the summer. After peaking in August, the rates of new Covid infections and hospital admissions have started to fall. Almost 59% of the population are fully vaccinated against Covid. A vaccination campaign targeting young people has been launched on social media channels. From 13 September, Swiss residents must show a Covid certificate to access indoor spaces like restaurants, bars, CHURCHES and museums in order to quash a fourth wave of infections that is putting pressure on hospitals. More than 10,600 people have died in connection with Covid-19 in Switzerland, which has a population of 8 6 million

b. From my Parish

We have started our routine programmes in Swiss Churches. Once

a year we celebrate «A day for the Migrants». We celebrated it on 26 September 2021 with many and different religious and cultural programmes of various nationalities in my parish. In my parish there are Catholics



from 16 countries. On 9 October 2021, 17 youngsters have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in two groups. October being a month of Rosary the Malayalee community of my parish have conducted 10 days of consecutive rosary prayer. This was an inspiration for other parish members indeed. On 24 October we are going to celebrate a 'Thanksgiving Harvest Festival' (Erntedank). This is a tradition in Switzerland that we give thanks to God for a good harvest which we received this year.

6. United Kingdom

a. Parish Life and Focolare Movement

The Focolare Movement began in Trent, an Italian town in 1943. Chiara Lubich (1920-2008), a Catholic, is the founder whose inspiration came from Jesus's prayer for unity, 'that they may all be one'. In the climate of violence and hatred of the Second World War, she saw God's love as the only antidote when civil life was crumbling around her. A group sharing her vision joined in helping those in the shelters and in the poorest parts of the town. When World War II ended, the women who lived together in Trent, who had formed the core of the movement, moved to different places. Eventually it spread to Europe and then worldwide. Those in Focolare live out the gospel values to erase division and create world peace. Its members come from many religions and even include those who are non-religious, though the movement is largely Catholic. Chiara Lubich was the first President of the movement; she was succeeded by Maria Voce and the current president is Margaret Karram. The heart of Charism of Unity of the Focolare Movement is trying to put into practice the prayer of Jesus, 'That all may be one'.

In Britain the movement is active. Since 2001 I have been closely associated with a group of 10/12 members - Catholic priests and deacons - belonging to this movement and regularly attend the Word of Life meeting every first Tuesday. We usually meet in the evening, read and reflect on a particular verse from the Bible, especially from the New Testament and share our experiences and conclude with evening prayer and meal together. This month (October) unfortunately. being not well, I could not join the group, but read and reflected on the Word of Life for this month, 'Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all.' (MK 9:35). I focussed on one aspect, 'Jesus had confidence in the disciples, despite their fragility and fears', in conjunction with the sharing of the experiences of two Focolare members: Fr Jonathan Cotton OSB and David Hickey. Fr Jonathan, from his personal conviction and ecumenical experience and still remaining a faithful Benedictine monk, says: 'I have a kind of revelation that God not to be found only in ritual and obedience to the Catholic Church, but that God himself loves me. I can see this from the presence of many people, from all walks of life and different strands of Christian living.' David Hickey says: 'When Jesus prayed "That all may be one", it was the dream of a God-Man. And we see it realised partially every time we experience real unity, not despite our differences, but often because of them.'

With these two inspiring experiences I shared with the parishioners my own reflection on Jesus' instruction to his disciples on love and tolerance. When Jesus found that his disciples could not accept the views of others who did not belong to their group, he categorically made it clear to them: 'Anyone who is not against us is for us.' Jesus came to save all peoples and to cooperate with him and continue his mission he chose the apostles. Through their successors we are to continue the same mission today with greater tolerance than ever, especially in the midst of various religions and denominations in the

same religion. It is this tolerance, born of love, that can respect others' right to their own thoughts, words and deeds of truth. What is this truth? God Himself as Jesus said: 'I am the way, the life and the truth.' Here we should keep in mind that there is far more than one way to God, as Tennyson, the Victorian poet says, 'God fulfils himself in many ways' or sixteenth century novelist and dramatist, Cervantes says, 'Many are the roads by which God carries his own to heaven.' It is this tolerance that welcomes a Mother Teresa, a Pope Benedict XVI, a Pope Francis, a Prime Minister Boris Johnson, a Prime Minister Narendara Modi, a President Joe Biden or anyone for that matter without any conflict of Christian or gospel values. Yes, mysterious are the ways of God. Let us remain united, not despite, but because of our differences. God Bless!

b. St. Simon Stock Roman Catholic Church, Ashford, Kent.

St Simon Stock Catholic Church, Ashford is in Kent, the far South-



East corner of Britain. Kent is known as 'the Garden of England' because of its abundance of fruit orchards and is just 15km across the English Channel from the north coast of France

It was the first area of Britain to be converted to Christianity in the 6th century after Pope Gregory I had sent the religious

missionary Augustine (later St. Augustine of Canterbury) to Christianize Kent, and he became the first Archbishop of Canterbury in 597. The Diocese of Canterbury became England's first Episcopal See and Canterbury Cathedral remains the 'Mother Church' of Christianity in England.

The Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel moved from their home in Palestine in the 13th Century and in 1247 came to Aylesford, Kent, the home of Simon Stock, when they migrated to England. The Blessed Virgin Mary is traditionally said to have appeared to Simon Stock and given him the Carmelite habit, the

Brown Scapular. He became one of the earliest Priors of the Order in Aylesford, which is still the site of a Carmelite Monastery and a place of pilgrimage and retreat.

24 kms from Canterbury, and 36 kms from Aylesford, is the market town of Ashford which is well known for the busy international railway station, numerous industrial estates, extensive retail outlets and an expanding general hospital.

The parish of St Simon of England, later renamed St. Simon Stock, was established in Ashford in 1987 and the church was consecrated on 31 October 1996. The parish is celebrating its Silver Jubilee this year on Sunday 31 October. Most Reverend John Wilson, Archbishop of Southwark is the principal celebrant. Former parish priests and priests from neighbouring parishes concelebrate with him which add the flavour of the celebration. On this occasion the parish is producing a glossy souvenir publication to mark the Jubilee with contributions from the Archbishop, all the former Parish Priests and many well-wishers.

2021 has also been a year of great celebration and blessing for the parish as, on 17 July, David Hunter, a young man who was baptised in our parish church, was ordained to the priesthood and he is the first one from our parish. He offered his first Mass in St Simon Stock Church and people were so enthusiastic to attend this august function.

c. Mar Sleeva Mission, Ashford (Eparchy of Great Britain)

Mar Sleeva Mission is functioning as a 'quasi' parish for the Syro-Malabar Catholics in Ashford, Kent. The geographical boundary of this Mission covers half of Kent region including many historical places such as Canterbury, Dover



and Ashford. Ashford is the hub of this Mission. Considering the vast area of it we have Holy Qurbana and catechism classes at two places namely Aylesham and Ashford on every Saturday and Sunday respectively. On special occasions we hire some common place where all can gather together for celebrations and boost family bindings.

As COVID 19 lockdown was lifted on 19 July 2021 we restarted various activities The first step was to organize a oneday get together for the youth and it was a wonderful experience for them. We had a series of administering sacraments such as Holy



Communion, Sacraments of initiation and wedding which were held back due to the lockdown. The Mission Council took a major decision to celebrate Mission Feast and mission family gathering in September.

Mar Sleeva Mission, celebrated its mission day and the feast of the exaltation of the Holy Cross on 18 September 2021 at Canterbury. Reverend Father Tebin Puthenpurackal CMI, the Regional (London) Youth Director was the main celebrant and Fr Jose Palliyil VC preached the homily. The colourful procession carrying statues of saints led the faithful to walk with nostalgic experience. The auction of garden products made the congregation more active and vibrant. As the part of mission day celebration there was public meeting and entertainment programmes. Award winners from catechism classes and different competitions were given prizes and all couples completed 25 years of married life were felicitated and honoured in public. The variety of cultural programmes were presented by kids and youth became one of the highlights of the ceremony.

Moving forward we restarted face-to-face catechism classes from the first week of October after the successful organization of the online classes during the covid-19 restriction time.

8. Australia

Updates from Nowra, Wollonggon (Syndney)

We, in the state of NSW, have been in lockdown since June 2021. Masses, essential meetings and appointments have moved online.

Sick call visits and Communion requests are permitted. Recorded Masses are uploaded every Saturday at 5pm, each church community taking turns. All six church communities of Berry, Bomaderry, Culburra Beach, Kangaroo Valley, Nowra and Vincentia stay updated via parish weekly bulletins published in the parish website, Facebook and sent to all on the Email list. Hard copies are distributed by local volunteers to those without internet access

Restrictions are expected to ease state-wide by 11 October for those who have taken both doses of the vaccine (70% state target). Further restrictions are expected to ease when the state achieves 80% double dose vaccinated population status. Mass in churches will resume by 25 October with restricted numbers, social distancing, masks and double vaccination.

By 1 December, all restrictions will be lifted and everyone, irrespective of vaccination status, will be able to attend Mass without wearing masks or social distance.

The vaccination drive is the most coveted campaign. The 'Million Dollar Vax' campaign is rewarding vaccinated people here with cash prizes and gift cards for doing their part, with a jackpot up for grabs worth \$1 million. Plus, there's another \$3.1 million worth of consolation prizes being given away. Every day in October, 100 winners are being drawn to win gift cards of \$1000. Looking forward to having people back in churches and life back to normal finally!

9. Sweden

We have three converted pastors from protestant churches and they have to study for four years to become priests in the Catholic diocese. Once a month in a weekend they are here in the seminary to



experience the community life. Their studies are all on-line. Just now they have finished one-third of their training. This week our Bishop will visit the 3 seminarians in Rome who are studying in 3 seminaries in Rome.

c. Study Tour to Holy Land

The diocese is arranging a study tour for the priests, sisters and leaders who are working with a vocation group together with some other dioceses. If everything goes well the tour will be in January 2022

d. Syro-Malabar Mission in Scandinavia

i. Celebration of Holy Masses: As the restrictions are over, we

have started normal masses for the faithful from Kerala who are in Sweden and Finland. Norway is still having many restrictions and hence we have no mass in




Norway. We have no more on-line masses at present.

ii. Catechism for the Children: We have started on-line catechism classes for the children in Sweden, Norway and Finland. It has got a very positive response. It is very useful at this time of pandemic and as we are in different countries.

a. New Arrivals in Italy

reached Rome on 14 September 2021. After 10 days of quarantine, they are now in their respective places of stay, study and ministry. Fr Rijo is appointed the assistant priest-in-charge at St Thomas the Apostle Cathedral parish, Orthona and he reached the Cathedral on 24 September. He has already started his service in the parish, along with Fr Biji Kudukkamthadam MST, the outgoing assistant priest-in-charge of the Cathedral parish. Fr Lijo stays at Pontificio Collegio Nepomuceno in Rome and does his studies at the Pontifical Institute of Arabic and Islamic Studies (PISAI) at Viale di Trastevere in Rome. Fr Arun stays at Collegio Damasceno at Via Boccea in Rome and does scriptural studies at Pontifical Biblical Institute (Biblicum) at Piazza della Pilotta in Rome.

b. Archdiocese of Lanciano-Ortona



Rev. Fr Biji Kudukkamthadam served the Cathedral parish at Ortona for about six years and Rev. Fr Joseph Koren served the parish at Tollo for about ten years. Now both of them are transferred to Crecchio, where Rev. Fr Joseph Koren will be the Parish Priest.

This is a parish that lies in between Ortona and Tollo. They took charge of the parish on 7 September 2021 during the Holy Mass. Archbishop Emidio Cipollone and Angelo Giordano, the Vicar General of the Archdiocese of

Lanciano-Ortona were present during the First Mass of the new priests in the parish.

The parish at Crecchio has a beautiful church at Crecchio and four substations with churches at Casino Vezzani. Villa Tucci, Selciaroli and Villa Consalvi. Holy Mass is



celebrated in all these churches. There are not many parishioners living around the central church at Crecchio. The majority of them live around the four substations. It is like a mission parish and the people are good. Now Fr Joseph Koren stays in a rented house for some time until the renovation works of the presbytery are complete. Fr Biji will later join Fr Joseph. African priests were there in this parish for about fifteen years and now it is entrusted to the MSTs.

c. Archdiocese of Spoleto-Norcia

Rev. Fr Elvis Mangalappilly, after having served the parishes of Torre



Orsina and Collestate in the Archdiocese of Spoleto-Norcia for nine long years, is now transferred to the parish of Cereto di Spoleto, some forty km away. This parish, on the way to Cascia, the city of St Rita, the patroness of families, has some twelve churches under it. It has also

proximity to Norcia, the city of St Benedict. This is an area affected often by earthquakes and many buildings, including the presbytery, are partially ruined. The renovation work of the presbytery is going on and till it is over Fr Elvis stays in a rented house. Archbishop Renato Boccardo introduced Fr Elvis to the new parish during the inaugural Holy Mass at Cereto di Spoleto on 3 October 2021.

Frs Joby Koottumkal and Tony Mampilly moved out of Collegio Damasceno. Fr Joby will stay at Casa San Giuseppe of the Missionaries of Divine Redemption at Via Appia Nuova and continue his studies. Fr Tony will stay at the Procura of the Syro-Malabar Church in Rome and continue his studies. All the MSTs in Italy are keeping fine and doing well.


requests for the physical meetings in the upcoming months.

1. New Schedule of Extraordinary General Assembly

The Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) which was convoked on 25 February 2021, had scheduled to start its sessions on 15 September 2021. The procedures for the EGA like the election of the delegates by the election committee, and the compilation of the agenda by the agenda committee are already done. However, considering several limitations of the present context, with the consent of the General Council I do postpone the schedule of the Extraordinary General Assembly to **15 March 2022**. The names received will be considered in consultation with the respective Regional Director of the applicant and with the consent of the General Council (C&D 44).

The minimum number of members required for constituting a new Mission Region is 12. (C58-c).

The appointment/election (D116) of the new Regional Director will be considered after assigning members to the new mission Region, based on their numerical strength (D116-c).

As directed by His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry, the Major Archbishop of the Syro-Malabar Church, may I remind you of the following two matters regarding the celebration of Holy Qurbana based on the decisions taken in the second session of the XXIX Synod of Bishops that was held online from 16 to 27 August 2021.

1. Revised Malayalam Text of the Syro-Malabar Holy Ourbana

The Apostolic See has given its approval for the revised text of the Holy Qurbana that was submitted for its review. The revised text in Malayalam will come into force on the first Sunday of the new liturgical year that falls on 28 November 2021 6 the beginning of the Season of Annunciation. The translation of the text into English, Hindi and other local languages is being taken up and it might take a few more months to get them finalized and implemented.

2. Uniform Mode of Celebration of the Holy Qurbana

You are well aware and informed of the exhortation of the Holy Father regarding the uniform mode of celebration of the Holy Qurbana in the whole Syro-Malabar Church from 28 November 2021. In this context, the synod studied and discussed the above exhortation of the Holy Father in detail and confirmed its obligation to exhort every faithful to obey the directives of the Holy Father (*CCEO* c. 45); and has exhorted everyone to implement that decision promptly and to follow it faithfully in the entire Syro-Malabar Church.

Hence the synod has decided for the revised text of the Holy Qurbana in the uniform mode of celebration from the beginning of the next liturgical year, may I request all the MST priests to follow such directions faithfully in all places of our apostolates, as applicable. The post-synodal pastoral letter of the Major Archbishop (Prot. No. 0923/2021 dated 27 August 2021) that explains the decision and its details, is appended to this letter [It is avoided here].

Let us continue our prayers for the Syro-Malabar Church that these decisions be accepted wholeheartedly by everyone and become a blessing.
